

All entries must be in the exhibit building by 5 p.m, Thursday, unless otherwise stated, and remain in place until released by Superintendents beginning on Saturday, at 8 a.m. and closing at 10 a.m. Premiums will also be paid at this time. Exhibits left after 10 a.m. will be at the risk of the
- The Exhibit Building will be cleared of all spectators and locked when entries close at 5 p.m., Thursday, during the judging of all exhibits. The building will be re-opened to the public immediately after the judging is completed. All Premiums will be forfeited if NOT PICKED UP by 10 A.M. Saturday.
- All property entered at the Fair shall be subject to the control of the Secretary or the Superintendent in charge.
- 7. Separate exhibits must be provided for each entry in each class except livestock. Individual ownership must be established if more than one entry in any class is made from the same farm or home
- Entry forms will be provided for listing of all entries and exhibitors are required to see that their exhibits are properly listed on same.
- The Superintendent of the Livestock Department will assign spaces or stalls and exhibitors will be expected to keep their spaces or stalls in clean condition at all times during the Fair. No collection of premium money will be paid until pens are cleaned up and left in good condition. All livestock must be in place by 6 p.m., Thursday. All livestock will be released on Saturday, unless otherwise authorized.
- 10. Hogs will not be allowed to be watered in the pens. They must be taken outside so as not to root up the floor. 11. Any officer of the Fair Association shall have access to all premises of any
- type on the grounds or concessions at any time during the Fair. 12. The decision of the judges shall be final and no appeal will be considered.
- 14. All bundles must have been grown in the past season. If old bundles are
 - entered, they will be disqualified and not judged. 15. The Executive Board reserves the final and absolute right to determine all
 - questions regarding the awarding of premiums. 16.
